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WORK NOTICE: TRANSITIONAL MEASURES AND SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS AT THE WESTMINSTER LEVEL CROSSING

Overnight work from September 28 to October 3, 2026

The Town of Montreal West will soon implement transitional measures on Westminster Avenue, between Milner Avenue and Avon Road to improve safety and traffic flow near the Westminster level crossing, a complex and high-traffic area where motorists, pedestrians, cyclists and trains intersect.

The work announced earlier this summer was postponed due to the CPKC signal workers' strike. The Town is now providing an updated schedule and an overview of the key changes that will be implemented in the area.

Work area



Scope of work

The project will include:

- Traffic management and preparatory work;
- Modification to traffic signage and pavement markings;
- Installation of delineator posts, flexible bollards, temporary barriers, and planter boxes
- Curb reductions at the intersections of Broughton Road and Avon Road to improve accessibility
- Installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB) at pedestrian crossings

Schedule

- Start of work: September 28, 2026 at 7:00 p.m.
- Expected completion: October 3, 2026 at 7:00 a.m.
- Working hours: 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

While most work will take place overnight, some activities may occur during the day; these will not require a complete closure, although a temporary lane deviation may be necessary.

** The schedule may be adjusted due to weather conditions or other operational requirements*

Temporary impacts during construction

During the work, residents are asked to follow all temporary signage, allow additional travel time in the area and move their vehicles when temporary parking restriction notices are posted.

Some activities may generate noise, dust and other temporary inconveniences. The contractor will take all reasonable measures to minimize disruptions.

Traffic impacts

- Full closure of Westminster Avenue between Milner Avenue and Avon Road from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m., with local traffic maintained through temporary traffic control measures;
- Des Érables Street will be temporarily opened at the intersection of Broughton Road (*Devil's Hill*) between 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. to enter and exit the Ainslie area during the closure of Westminster Avenue. The bollards will be reinstalled each morning;
- Local detours will be in place, check the website for detour plans;
- Occasional lane closures, with traffic maintained through temporary signage;
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions;
- Access to properties will be maintained unless otherwise indicated;
- Pedestrian and cyclist access will be maintained at all times.

New traffic configuration following the work

Following the completion of the project, a new traffic configuration will be implemented to improve safety and mobility for all road users. Changes will include modifications to traffic patterns on Westminster Avenue, including left-turn restrictions from Sherbrooke and Broughton, reconfigured travel lanes, the addition of planter boxes and pavement markings, and the installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons at pedestrian crossings.
